Billy Martin must have quickly worn out his welcome in Texas...The team, which had showed great promise in '74, fizzled in the Texas heat in '75...Managers' records: Martin (44-51), Lucchesi (35-32). Frank Lucchesi managed his first game, July 22nd...Jeff Burroughs led the ball club with 29 dingers and 94 runs batted in. Mike Hargrove, who developed a regular habit of anxiously readjusting his batting gloves, pawing the dirt, incessantly, with his toes at home plate, and constantly stepping in and out of the batter's box, led the Rangers in hitting at .303. (He earned the funny nickname "The Human Rain Delay.") Toby Harrah was second among the hitters with 20 home runs and 93 RBI. Lenny Randle led the ball club in hits (166) and runs scored (85). Texas batters hit .256 and 134 home runs... Staff ace Ferguson Jenkins topped the hurlers with 17 victories, 157 strikeouts, and 22 complete games. Gaylord Perry, acquired from Cleveland, posted a 12-8 record with 148 K's and 15 complete games. The staff ERA was 3.86...The Rangers trailed division champion, Oakland, by 19 games at the end of the season. The A's won the season series, 12-6.
