Manager Jack McKeon was fired, July 24th, with a record of 50-46. Much more was expected of this Royals team which "turned the corner" with the arrival of McKeon's successor, Dorrel Norman Elvert "Whitey" Herzog. Herzog, a career baseball man, had performed well in a variety of roles: player, scout and general manager. He is most noted for his success in the dugout as a manager. After taking over the ball club, he guided them to a record of 41-25...First baseman John Mayberry, Sr. led the Royals with 34 home runs, 106 RBI, and 95 runs scored. Harmon Killebrew, picked up during the off-season, contributed 14 dingers and 44 RBI. George Brett, soon to become "the face of the franchise," ended the year with a .308 batting average including a team high 195 base hits. He compiled a "triple double": 35 doubles, 13 triples, and 11 homers. Brett knocked in 90 runs which was second on the team. In 93 games, Tony Solaita socked 16 round-trippers and drove in forty-four. K. C. hit .261, 118 home runs, and led the A.L. in triples (58). The ball club stole 155 bases, third in the league...Kansas City ace Steve Busby topped the club with 18 wins, 160 strikeouts, and 18 complete games. Al Fitzmorris was 16-12 and completed eleven ball games. Dennis Leonard went 15-7 for the season and struck out 146 batters. Spot starter Marty Pattin wound up ten and ten for wins/losses. The pitching staff finished fourth in the A.L. with a 3.47 ERA...Kansas City spent eleven days in first place of the AL West. The last day was June 3rd when they held a half-game lead with a 30-20 record. The rest of the year they were in second place. When the calendar turned to September, the team was 7 1/2 games out of first.
