On May 4th, the Phillies acquired the team's future "Secretary of Defense," Garry Maddox, from the Giants for the popular Willie Montanez. After lobbying from some of the Phils' star players, the ball club brought Dick Allen back to Philly for his power bat. (Allen needed a lot of persuasion from his future teammates, too.) On May 14th, at "The Vet," Allen stepped to the plate for the first time since the end of the 1969 season and drew a standing ovation. His single moments later earned him ANOTHER standing ovation from the now delirious Phillies' fans...The Phillies wore WHITE shoes (a la the Oakland A's) in '75...Mike Schmidt's 38 home runs led the ball club. He was second in RBI (95) and runs scored (93). Greg Luzinski (34 homers) posted the team high in RBI (120). "The Bull" was second in base hits (179). Allen went on to hit 12 homers and drive in 62 runs. Dave Cash, who brought with him a winning attitude from the Pirates in '74, led the majors in hits (213). He led the Phils in runs scored (111) and doubles (40). The home run total (125) for the Phils ranked them second in the league. They hit .269 as a team with a league leading 283 doubles...Steve Carlton led the pitching staff with 15 wins, 192 strikeouts, 14 complete games, and three shutouts. Lefty Tom Underwood was a 14-game winner while Larry Christenson won 11 games. The staff ERA was 3.82, ninth in the N.L...The Phils are on the rise: They finished 6 1/2 games behind NL East champion, Pittsburgh, but WON the season series, 11-7. It was their first winning season in eight years.
