George "Boomer" Scott did it all for the Brewers with 36 home runs, 109 RBI, 176 base hits, and 86 runs scored as the default leader of the team. Catcher Darrell Porter followed with 18 dingers and tied Henry Aaron with 60 runs batted in. Aaron, who had been acquired from Atlanta in the off-season, returned to the place where he started his Hall of Fame career in 1954. Used almost exclusively as a designated hitter, "The Hammer" socked 12 home runs for the season. Slick-fielding third-sacker Don Money added 15 homers. Second-year shortstop Robin Yount was good for eight round-trippers and 52 RBI. He was second on the ball club with 149 hits. The Brewers hit .250 (tenth in the A.L.) and 146 home runs (third in the league)...Starter Pete Broberg topped the pitching staff with 14 victories. Jim Slaton (11-18) rang up the most strikeouts (119) and led the staff with 10 complete games including three shutouts. Jim Colborn was 11-13 and pitched eight complete games. The staff finished at the bottom of the A.L. with a 4.34 ERA, a meager 643 strikeouts, and the most runs allowed (792)...Aaron's former teammate with the Braves when the franchise was in Milwaukee, Del Crandall was fired from his managerial duties with one game left to go...Only one season series ended in the Brewers favor, 11-7 over Detroit.
