The Angels were LAST in the A.L. with 55 homers and a .246 batting average. They led the league in steals (220). Leroy Stanton was the team leader with 14 dingers and 82 RBI. Part-timers Joe Lahoud and Adrian Garrett followed with six home runs. Mickey Rivers led the Angels in hits (175)...Frank Tanana and Ed Figueroa both won sixteen games and completed sixteen to lead the pitching staff. Tanana led the staff with 269 K's. Nolan Ryan was 14-12 in wins/losses with 186 strikeouts, 132 bases on balls, 10 complete games, and five shutouts (the latter a tie with Tanana). The staff's ERA was 3.89 with an A.L. leading 13 shutouts and 975 strikeouts...Boston pitcher Bill Lee was heard to say this about the Angels' hitters: "They could take batting practice in a hotel lobby without damaging a chandelier."
