There wasn't a lot for the Cubs to celebrate during their 100th season in the National League and 60th campaign at "The Friendly Confines." The burly Brothers Reuschel (Rick and Paul) were known for carrying a hot plate on road trips to cook hamburgers in their hotel room. As big as he was, starter Rick could field his position as well as any pitcher in the game...The next best team highlight? Bill "Mad Dog" Madlock was the National League batting champ (.354). He was tied for the team lead in hits (182) with Jose Cardenal. Andre Thornton topped the ball club with 18 home runs. Jerry Morales (12 dingers) was the leader with 91 runs batted in. Rick Monday slugged 17 homers and had the team high in runs scored (89). For the year, the Cubbies hit .259 as a team and 95 home runs...Number One starter Ray Burris won 15 ball games as leader of the pitching staff. Bill Bonham (13-15) was the staff's strikeout king (165). Steve Stone won twelve games and Rick Reuschel was a winner of eleven. The staff ERA of 4.49 was at the bottom of the N.L. They allowed a league worst 827 runs...Billy Williams had been traded to Oakland in the off-season while Burt Hooton was dealt to the Dodgers.
