The off-season hiring of former player agent Brodie Van Wagenen as General Manager and a trade with Seattle for the ultra-priced Robinson Cano and closer Edwin Diaz were subjects which created much heated debate and angst at that time and well into the season. Cano's range in the field had noticeably retreated to below-average and his silent bat in the season's first half was a sore thumb. Diaz, the prime member of the trade and slated to be the Mets new closer (a major league high 57 saves with the Mariners in '18), couldn't get anyone out as part of a bullpen which regularly blew up and surrendered late-inning runs leading to losses. To start the year's second half, the ball club was eleven games below .500 (40-51, the season's lowest mark) but soon after picked up some energy and started to win ball games. A 46-25 record in the year's latter half gave the team and fans a newfound hope of at least reaching the second Wild Card spot. They challenged right up to the last days of the campaign...Pete Alonso wowed fans all over baseball after slugging the most homers in a season for a rookie (53) which garnered him the N. L. Rookie of the Year Award. He led the Mets in runs scored (103) and RBI (120). Amed Rosario collected the most base hits (177). The team BA was .257; they walloped 242 home runs...Jacob deGrom, arguably the best pitcher in the game, won his second straight Cy Young Award. He topped the pitching staff with 255 strikeouts. deGrom, Zack Wheeler, and Steven Matz all won 11 games. Noah Syndergaard picked up a W in ten. The staff ERA (4.24) placed the Mets sixth in the league.
