The Bosox, as defending World Champions, got off to a bad start (13-17 in April) due to underutilizing the starting staff in Spring Training games--according to the pundits. Nevertheless, ace Chris Sale dealt with arm woes early in the season while his fellow rotation members struggled. The ballclub did reach second place in the AL East (59-47, 8 games out) on July 27th, then fell to third the next day and finished a flat 25-31...J. D. Martinez (36 HR, 105 RBI); Xander Bogaerts (33 HR, 117 RBI); and Rafael Devers (32 HR, 115 RBI) led the offense. "Mookie" Betts was slowed by leg problems, but finished strong with 29 HR and 80 RBI. Devers and Bogaerts were in the mix for the league batting championship all season. The Red Sox hit .269 and 245 homers, 3rd and 6th, respectively, in the league...Eduardo Rodriguez (19 wins, 213 K's) and Rick Porcello (14 W's) kept the pitching staff from floating away down the Charles River. Sale won six games and posted the most strikeouts (218). The relief corps was lacking in dependability the entire year. The staff ERA (4.70) was seventh in the league...Baseball Operations guru Dave Dombrowski was fired Sept. 9th.
