Twins Facts: Clinched AL Central title for the first time since 2010 on September 25th...Second-most wins for a season since moving to Minneapolis from Washington, D. C. for the 1961 campaign...Set new major league record with 307 home runs as a team...Seeded third for the American League playoffs...The Twins finished second in the league with a robust .270 batting average. DH Nelson Cruz (108 RBI) was the team leader with 41 homers. Eddie Rosario (32 HR) had the most RBI (109). Max Kepler and Miguel Sano blasted 36 and 34 home runs, respectively, while Mitch Garver clubbed 31. Jorge Polanco's 186 base hits and 107 runs scored were team highs...Jake Odorizzi's 15 wins topped the pitching staff. Jose Berrios followed with 14 victories and a staff-high total of 195 strikeouts. Kyle Gibson added 13 wins. The staff ERA was 4.18...In the ALDS versus the Yankees, the Twins were outscored 23-7 and hit .218 to "The Pin-Strippers".293. Luis Arraez was 5-11 (.455) with four doubles. New York won the series three games to none.
