The Redbirds took sole possession of first place in the NL Central, August 23rd, and clinched their first division crown since 2015 on September 29th. They edged out the Brewers by two games..The Cards hit .245 and 210 home runs. They tied the Nationals for the league lead in stolen bases (116). Paul Goldschmidt, obtained in a trade with Arizona, inked a new multi-year contract and was the team leader with 34 homers, 97 RBI, and 155 base hits. Paul DeJong (30 home runs, 78 RBI) tied Goldschmidt for a team-high 97 runs scored. Marcell Ozuna clubbed 29 home runs and drove in 89..The pitching staff ended the year with a smart 3.80 ERA which was second-best in the league. Their 52 saves placed them at the top of the list. Dakota Hudson, 24, was the staff's big winner with a 16-7 W/L record. Jack Flaherty, 23, won eleven, led the hurlers with 231 strikeouts, and completed the season looking like the Cards Number One starter. Old stalwart Adam Wainwright, 37, was 14-10 and struck out 153 batters. John Gant won eleven games working out of the bullpen..In the post-season, the Cardinals reversed a 2-1 deficit to dispatch Atlanta in the NLDS, 3-2, but were dominated and swept from the NLCS by Washington, 4-0...They posted a .989 fielding percentage, the best in the major leagues.
