The Dodgers hit .257 and 279 home runs, the latter the most in N. L. history. Cody Bellinger was the team leader in homers (47), RBI (115), base hits (170), and runs scored (121). Joc Pederson blasted 36 home runs; Max Muncy followed with 35 jacks and was second in RBI (98) to Bellinger...The pitching staff led the league with an outstanding 3.37 ERA. Clayton Kershaw was the top winner with sixteen and only five losses. Walker Buehler and Hyun-Jin Ryu both posted 14 victories. Buehler was the staff leader with 215 strikeouts while Ryu ended the year with the majors' lowest ERA (2.32)...The Dodgers simply ran away from the pack to the NL West title. They ended the year with a 21-game lead and 50 wins over .500 after taking sole possession of first place for good April 17th...In the NLDS, the Dodgers and Nationals split the first four games with the Nats winning the final, decisive contest, 7-3, in ten innings at Dodger Stadium...Nearly four million fans made the trek to Chavez Ravine to view the Dodger "nine"...Bellinger was hitting .404 as late as May 21st.
