With an influx of new talent from a plentiful farm system and the arrival of the 300-million-dollar-man, Manny Machado, through free-agency, the Padres painted a bright future for the franchise for years to come. Machado, who drove home 85 runs and led the team with 81 runs scored and 32 home runs, was a great disappoint. The Padres season was a bust which cost manager Andy Green his job on September 20<sup>th</sup> with a 69-85 record. Eric Hosmer topped the ballclub with 99 RBI and 164 base hits but his slow start at the plate contributed to the team's less-than-inspiring start. At the All Star Game recess, they were fourth in the NL West, 14 games out of first and 45-45...Joey Lucchesi, 26, had the most wins on the pitching staff (10) as well as the most strikeouts (158). Rookie Chris Paddock, 23, didn't disappoint with the best ERA among the starters and 153 punch outs. He won nine ballgames and allowed only 31 walks. Closer Kirby Yates (101 K's) led the majors in saves...For the year, the Padres hit .238 (last in the N. L.) and 219 home runs (10<sup>th</sup>). The staff ERA was 4.60, placing them twelfth in the league.
