Rookie manager and former major-league utility-infielder Chris Woodward's Rangers failed to step over the .500 mark for an extended period of time until the end of May. From May 31st through July 23rd, the ballclub played its best baseball and finally crossed over that line for 52 straight days. They dropped below .500 once again August 15th and remained there the remainder of the year, finishing 29 games behind AL West champion Houston. The Astros won the season series, 13-6...As a team, the Rangers hit a composite .248 and 223 home runs. They were the league leader with 131 stolen bases. Rougned Odor was a huge disappoint at the plate, but still led the team with 30 homers and 93 RBI. Danny Santana followed with 28 jacks and 81 runs batted in. Eight other players popped a combined 138 home runs...The pitching staff's 5.06 ERA ranked them 11th in the league. Newcomer Lance Lynn posted the most wins (16) and strikeouts (246). Lefty Mike Minor followed with 14 victories and 200 K's. Closer Jose Leclerc whiffed 100 batters...The Rangers wrapped up their 26th and final season at their second ball yard in Arlington with an overall record of 1,145-936, a .550 winning percentage. The new Globe Life Field, a stadium with a retractable roof, will open in March 2020 to help players and fans, alike, escape the searing heat during a Texas summer.
