The Rays have come a long way from their lowly standing as a 1998 expansion team. Despite the lowest fan attendance in the A. L. at Tropicana Field seemingly every year, the team with one of the perennially lowest payrolls, finds a way to win with amateur drafts spawning excellent talent to go with discarded veterans who produce beyond expectations...One of those young players, Austin Meadows, 24, given up by the Pirates through a trade for pitcher Chris Archer in 2018, led the ball club with 33 home runs, 89 RBI, and 83 runs scored. Veteran Tommy Pham led the team in base hits (155) and added 21 homers to the Rays season total of 217. Avisail Garcia drove home 72 runs and smacked 20 home runs. The discarded Travis d'Arnaud (by the Mets and Dodgers), was a boon to the offense with 16 jacks and 67 RBI after his arrival May 10th...The pitching staff had the lowest ERA in the league (3.65). "Discard" Charlie Morton had a 16-6 W/L record and led the staff in strikeouts (240). Home-grown Blake Snell, 26, the 2018 Cy Young winner, battled arm maladies most of the year and finished 6-8 with 147 K's...The Rays led/tied for first in the AL East for 45 days early in the season, but dropped to second for good, May 19th...Their record earned them the second AL Wild Card spot. They beat Oakland, 5-1, in the Wild Card Game out West before being eliminated by Houston in the ALDS three games to two. The Astros had taken a 2-0 lead before the Rays won the next two at home...The team batting average was .254.
