Royal Ramblings: K. C. was 9-20 and 9 ½ games behind the AL Central leader at the end of April; the rest of the season was a disaster. At the All Star break they were last with a 30-61 record and 27 games out of first. The ball club would fall as many as 45 games below .500 on September 28th. As a team they hit .247 (10th in the A. L.) and 162 home runs (14th). The pitching staff's ERA of 5.20 placed them thirteenth out of fifteen teams in the league. The Royals stole the second-most bases (117)...**Team Leaders:** Jorge Soler (48 homers, 117 RBI); Whit Merrifield (206 base hits, 105 runs scored, 41 doubles). Soler's home run total was a league-high; his .922 OPS led the ball club. He struck out 178 times, the most in the A. L...Jakob Junis (9-14 W/L record, 164 K's) topped the staff in wins and strikeouts, respectively. Brad Keller followed with seven victories and 122 punch outs. Both Danny Duffy and "Homer" Bailey also won seven ballgames...Prior to the season's wind-up, manager Ned Yost announced he would retire after ten years in the Royals dugout. As K. C. skipper he was 746-839 (.471) which includes a World Series title in 2015 and two American League pennants (2014, 2015).
