**Team leaders: Mickey Mantle (40 home runs, 94 RBI, 119 runs scored); Roger Maris (39 homers, 112 RBI); Bill Skowron (26 dingers, 91 RBI, 166 base hits). Yogi Berra hit 15 home runs and drove in sixty-two. Maris was named the American League's Most Valuable Player...Elston Howard became the Yanks starting catcher while Berra moved into a back-up role behind the plate and in the outfield...Art Ditmar led the pitching staff with fifteen wins. Jim Coates won thirteen games and "Whitey" Ford ended the season with twelve victories...As a team, the Yankees hit .260 and led the league with 193 home runs and 746 runs scored...The pitching staff was tops in the A. L. with a 3.52 ERA, twelve shutouts, and forty-two saves.**

**The Yanks won the American League pennant by eight games over Baltimore and took the season series with the Orioles, 13-9...The famous 1960 World Series came down to a seventh, decisive game in Pittsburgh, October 13<sup>th</sup>. Baseball fans know the Pirates did the almost unthinkable when Bill Mazeroski hit his walk-off home run to win the finale, 10-9, after the Bucs had been drilled by the Yankees in three prior contests, 16-3, 10-0, and 12-0. Bobby Richardson, despite being on the losing team, was named World Series MVP. Richardson hit .367 and drove home twelve runs in The Series.**

"The Ol' Perfessor," Casey Stengel, was fired by the Yankees after the season. Management claimed ol' Case' was TOO OLD to manage anymore. Casey was back with the hapless Mets in 1962. He was a GREAT ONE, NUMBER 37.
