Team leaders: Roger Maris (33 homers, 100 RBI); Mickey Mantle (30 home runs, 89 RBI); Tom Tresh (20 homers, 93 RBI); Elston Howard (21 home runs, 91 RBI); and Bill Skowron (23 homers with 80 RBI). Mantle was also named the American League's Most Valuable Player...Ralph Terry led the pitching staff with a 23-12 won/loss record, 176 strikeouts, and 14 complete games. Edward Charles "Whitey" Ford was 17-8 with 160 K's. Bill Stafford was 14-9 on the season...Part-timer Yogi Berra hit ten home runs and drove in thirty-five...The Bronx Bombers and San Francisco Giants traded victories through the first six games of the World Series with New York winning the decisive seventh game, 1-0, (a singleton in the top of the fifth). Willie McCovey hit a hard liner to Yank second baseman Bobby Richardson for the final out of The Series with two out and the tying and possible winning runs on third and second base. It was the Yankees' 20th World Series crown and their last until 1977...The Yanks led the A. L. in batting average (.267), runs scored (817), and hits (1,509). They knocked out 199 home runs (2nd)...The pitching staff was second in the league with a 3.70 ERA...New York won the American League pennant by just five games over Minnesota--a team that only two years earlier had been the lousy, original Washington Senators. The Yanks won the season series over the Twins, 11-7. They dominated the new, expansion Senators ball club, 15-3.
