The A's beat the Mets, four games to three, to win their second consecutive World Series crown. During a Game Two loss, Mike Andrews committed back-to-back errors in the 12th inning which drew the ire of Oakland owner, Charlie Finley. Finley forced Andrews off the team by "admitting" to "an injury" (he wasn't hurt); Finley wanted the previously ineligible Manny Trillo to take Andrews' spot. Andrews' teammates, manager, and many fans voiced their support. Commissioner Bowie Kuhn ordered Finley to restore Andrews to the squad. After missing Game Three, Andrews was back in uniform for Game Four. After grounding out in that game, Finley again ordered Andrews benched for the remainder of the series. Mike never played another game in the majors...Team leaders: Reggie Jackson (32 homers, 117 RBI, 99 runs scored); Sal Bando (29 home runs, 98 RBI, 170 base hits); Gene Tenace (24 homers, 84 RBI)...The A's boasted THREE 20-game winners: Ken Holtzman and "Catfish" Hunter each with twenty-one, and Vida Blue with twenty. Blue led the pitching staff in strikeouts (158) while Holtzman led the hurlers with 16 complete games...Reggie Jackson was selected as the American League's Most Valuable Player...The A's knocked off the Orioles, 3-2, in a hard-fought ALCS after Oakland won the regular season series, 7-5...The Athletics hit 147 home runs and .260 as a club while the hurlers turned in a 3.29 ERA in winning their third straight AL West championship.
