The A's beat the Reds in the Fall Classic, four games to three, for the franchise's first World Championship since 1930 when the ball club called Philadelphia home...The '72 ALCS featured a bench-clearing confrontation when "Campy" Campaneris hurled his bat at the Tigers' Lerrin LaGrow after the latter hit the former in the ankle during the seventh inning of Game Two. ("Campy" was three for three with two stolen bases at the time.) Both players were suspended for the rest of the series...Mike Epstein led the A's with 26 home runs. Reggie Jackson slammed 25 homers and knocked in seventy-five. Sal Bando, with 15 home runs, was the RBI leader (77). Joe Rudi had a team high 181 base hits and 94 runs scored..."Catfish" Hunter was tops on the pitching staff with a 21-7 record and 191 strikeouts. Ken Holtzman was 19-11 and Johnny Odom 15-6 for the season. Vida Blue was only 6-10 with 111 strikeouts...Owner Charlie Finley paid any player a \$500 bonus to grow a mustache by Father's Day. All team members, including the coaching staff, complied...The A's hit .240 for the season and a league leading 134 home runs. The pitching staff recorded a 2.58 ERA (second in the A.L.) and led the league with 15 shutouts. Oakland won the ALCS over Detroit, 3-2...For the year, the A's scored 604 runs while allowing opponents to score 457 times.
