The National League added two new teams in '69 with the Padres playing in the Western Division...Nate Colbert led the fledging ball club with 24 homers while Ollie Brown added twenty and was tops with 150 hits. Colbert was the RBI leader with sixty-six. As a team, the Padres hit .225 (LAST in the N.L.) and 99 homers (10th)...Joe Nickro and Al Santorini were the pitching staff's top winners with eight apiece. Clay Kirby's 113 K's were the most among the hurlers. The staff's ERA was 4.24 (11th)...The Padres scored 468 runs and allowed 746 for the year. San Diego won their first game at home over Houston, 2-1. They finished 41 games behind first place Atlanta.
