**The "Cincinnati" Reds played their home games at the same site from 1884 'til 1970: Findlay Street and Western Avenue in the "Queensgate" section of the city. From 1902 to 1911 it was known as "The Palace of the Fans." It then was called "Redland Field" before becoming Crosley Field in 1934. The name comes from Powel Crosley, Jr., a Cincinnati entrepreneur and inventor, who owned the team from 1934 until his death just before the season opened in 1961...Team leaders: Frank Robinson (31 homers, 83 RBI); Vada Pinson (a "triple double" with 37 doubles, 12 triples, and 20 home runs); knuckleball specialist Bob Purkey (17 victories, 11 complete games); and Jim O'Toole with 124 strikeouts. Pinson also led the ball club with 187 base hits and 107 runs scored...For the season, the Reds hit .250 with 140 home runs and 230 doubles--the latter two figures second in the league. Their seventy-three stolen bases ranked them third. The staff ERA was 4.00 and first in the N.L. with thirty-six saves...The Redlegs finished 28 games behind the World Champion Pirates from whom they won only six of twenty-two games...A young Cincinnati native, Peter Edward Rose, was signed as an amateur free-agent, July 8<sup>th</sup>.**
