The fledgling Rockies played their very first game at Shea Stadium against the Mets, April 5th. The ball club's first pick in the expansion draft, pitcher David Nied, was the losing hurler in a 3-0 loss. Colorado beat the Expos, 11-4, April 9th, in their home opener behind former Expo Bryn Smith...Charlie Hayes led the team with 25 homers, 175 base hits, and 45 doubles. Andres Galarraga (22 homers) and Hayes tied for the team lead in RBI (98). Dante Bichette (21 home runs, 43 doubles) scored the most runs (93). The Rockies finished third in the N.L. in hitting (.273), seventh in homers (142), and first in triples (59)...Armando Reynoso topped the pitching staff with twelve wins and four complete games. Bruce Ruffin (6-5 W/L record) led the staff with 126 strikeouts. Denver's thin air contributed greatly to the inflated staff ERA of 5.41, the worst in the major leagues in '93...Mile High Stadium, the ball club's temporary home through the '95 season, hosted 4.4 million fans that first year, the most in the majors.
