The former Montreal Expos now call Washington, D. C., home with the old expansion Senators' RFK Stadium their new temporary home turf. The "Nats" got off to a great start with a 51-32 record by July 5th, but struggled to go 30-49 the rest of the season. They scored 3.78 runs per game (299 total) during those 79 contests...Jose Guillen led the ball club with 24 homers, 76 RBI, 156 hits and 81 runs scored. Nick Johnson was second with 15 dingers and 74 RBI. The Nationals were last in the league with a .252 team batting average, 639 runs scored and 117 home runs...Livan Hernandez, The Nats lone All Star, led the pitching staff with 15 wins. John Patterson (9-7 W/L record) was the leader with 185 strikeouts. Esteban Loaiza was 12-10 with 173 K's. The staff ERA (3.87) was ranked fourth in the N.L. while they led the league in saves (51)... Washington ended its first season of National League baseball with an attendance of just over 2.7 million.
