This was the last season the Athletics called Kansas City "Home" after transferring from Philadelphia prior to the 1955 campaign...The legendary and very eccentric Charles O. Finley had bought the ball club from Arnold Johnson (who had moved the team to K. C.) in December 1960. Finley hatched some out-of-the-ordinary things at Municipal Stadium to entertain crowds viewing BAD baseball teams: A mechanical rabbit popping up from underneath the ground behind home plate to feed umpires fresh baseballs; goats grazing on high ground beyond the rightfield fence; and the soon-to-be very popular gold and kelly green uniforms with the trademark white shoes...There was a group of up-and-coming stars on Charlie's team: "Catfish" Hunter, "Campy" Campaneris, Rick Monday, Sal Bando, Johnny Odom, and two youngsters who made their major league debuts in April and June, respectively: Joe Rudi and Reginald Martinez Jackson...Monday led the Athletics with 14 homers and 58 RBI while Hunter led the pitching staff with thirteen wins and 196 K's. Jim Nash won twelve and Chuck Dobson ten games. The staff ERA was last in the A. L. (3.68) and allowed the most runs (660)...K. C. batters hit .233 and were last with 69 homers. They led the A. L. with 50 triples and 132 stolen bases...Managers' records: Dark (52-69), Appling (10-30).
