The defending World Champions chased the Red Sox the entire season to finish with the best record in the majors. The Red Sox led at the wire with 108 wins. The Astros also ended the year just six games ahead of the resurgent Athletics in the AL West... Alex Bregman had a break-out season after posting a team-leading 31 homers, 103 RBI, 170 base hits, and 105 runs scored. He led the majors by collecting 51 doubles and finished fifth in league MVP voting. Evan Gattis followed with 25 home runs while George Springer popped twenty-two. The Astros hit .255 for the season (4th in the A. L.) and 205 homers (7th)... Ace Justin Verlander was second in voting for the A. L. Cy Young Award and tenth in MVP tallies. Verlander turned in a dominating campaign: 16-9 W/L record and a league leading 290 strikeouts. He allowed only 37 bases on balls. Former Pirate Gerrit Cole polished off a Cy Young-type season with a 15-5 record and 276 K's. Charlie Morton was 15-3 and rang up 201 punch outs. Houston acquired closer Roberto Osuna from the Blue Jays mid-season but at that time he was on the suspended list after a domestic battery charge. When he finally returned to the mound, he posted an ERA under 2.00 and saved 12 games in 23 appearances. An outstanding staff ERA of 3.11 placed the Astros atop American League combos. Their 1,687 strikeouts also led the league while they allowed the fewest hits by the opposition (1,164)... The Astros dispatched Cleveland in the ALDS, 3-0, but were eliminated from post-season play by the eventual World Champion Red Sox, four games to one, in the ALCS. Verlander won Game One at Boston, 7-2.
