Cubbie fans celebrated their fourth consecutive trip to the post-season along with their diamond-darlings. At the end of the regular schedule, Chicago was tied with the upstart Brewers for the top spot in the NL Central. To determine the division champion, Milwaukee came to Wrigley Field for a tie-breaker game which the Brewers won, 3-1. This left the Cubs to play Colorado in the NL Wild Card Game resulting in a heart-breaking 2-1 thirteen-inning loss to the Rockies at Wrigley, eliminating them from the playoffs...Javier Baez finished second in NL MVP voting off a season in which he led the Cubs in homers (34), RBI (111), base hits (176), and runs scored (101). He topped the N. L. in RBI and ended the year third in the majors. Kyle Schwarber popped 26 home runs while Anthony Rizzo, after a puzzling slow start, hit 25 and knocked home 101 runs. The Cubs had the best batting average in the league (.258) and socked 167 home runs (1st)...Jon Lester posted the most wins on the pitching staff (18). Kyle Hendricks compiled the most strikeouts (161) to go with his 14 victories. Jose Quintana added thirteen wins and 158 K's. The staff ERA (3.65) placed them second among their N. L. competition... "The Friendly Confines" welcomed over 3.18 million fans to watch baseball in one of

the game's "Cathedrals".
