The M's have the longest post-season absence in all of the major league sports: Seattle has failed to make the play-offs since 2001. They had a ding-dong race with Oakland for the American League Wild Card spot--leading the A's several times by ten games--but wound up ending the season eight games behind the ball club By-the-Bay...Ichiro Suzuki ended his playing career (for now) with the Mariners where it all began. The probable first-ballot Hall of Famer moved to the M's front office on May 3rd. Nelson Cruz topped Seattle with 37 home runs and 97 RBI. Jean Segura posted the most base hits (178) and runs scored (91). As a team, they hit .254 and 176 home runs...Marco Gonzales tallied the most wins on the pitching staff (13) while fellow lefty James Paxton punched out 208 foes to lead the hurlers. Closer Edwin Diaz struck out 124 batters. The staff ERA was 4.13 and led the A. L. in saves (60).
