The Orioles, originally the forlorn St. Louis Browns, set a new franchise record for losses in a season. They were the first major league team which failed to reach fifty wins since the 2003 Detroit Tigers. The Birds were eliminated from any chance of reaching the post-season on August 11th...Manny Machado and Trey Mancini were co-leaders in home runs (24). Machado also led the ball club with 65 RBI. Adam Jones topped the O's in base hits (163); Mancini scored the most runs (69). The Orioles were LAST in the A.L. with a .239 batting average. They slugged 188 homers (9th)...The pitching staff's ERA (5.18) was the league's worst. Dylan Bundy posted eight wins and 184 strikeouts to lead the staff. Alex Cobb and Kevin Gausman both won five contests...Baltimore was shut out fifteen times and did not win a single season series. They finished an alarming sixty-one games out of first place in the AL East. Skipper "Buck" Showalter was let go at the end of the season after nine years in the dugout and four winning campaigns.
