The Dodgers won their sixth straight NL West flag after a tie-breaker game with the Rockies, but it was a tough road to get there... Shortstop Corey Seager was lost early in the year to Tommy John surgery on his right elbow. However, L. A. was deep enough to plug in replacements--productive ones--to fill this gaping hole. Super-sub Max Muncy led the Dodgers with 35 home runs. A rejuvenated and healthy Matt Kemp was the leader with 85 RBI. Cody Bellinger's 145 base hits were tops on the team while Chris Taylor posted the most runs scored (85). L. A.'s 235 homers led the N.L., but their .250 batting average placed them eighth... The Dodgers' strong suit was pitching: Number One in ERA (3.38), most strikeouts (1,565), and fewest runs allowed (610). Rich Hill led the staff with eleven wins. An injury plagued Clayton Kershaw won nine games along with Alex Wood. Kershaw was the leader in strikeouts (155)... The Dodgers opened the campaign 16-26 before going on a 76-45 run the rest of the way. They knocked off the Braves in the NLDS and Milwaukee in the NLCS before going down in five games in the World Series to the dominating Boston Red Sox.
