Another Nats ball club with high expectations but finished a disappointing second after having a lock on third place from June 22nd through September 23rd...Bryce Harper, a soon-to-be highly sought-after free-agent, led the team with 34 homers and 100 RBI. He tied Trea Turner for a team high 103 runs scored. Turner topped the Nats with 180 base hits. Anthony Rendon tied the Braves Freddie Freeman with 44 doubles, the most in the N. L. Nineteen-year-old rookie Juan Soto blasted 22 home runs and drove in seventy in only 414 at bats. He was second in NL Rookie of the Year voting. As a team, Washington hit .254 and 191 home runs...Ace Max Scherzer was the major league leader with 300 strikeouts and in innings pitched; he tied for the N. L. lead in victories (18). Stephen Strasburg was a ten-game winner with 156 punch outs. The pitching staff's ERA ended the year at 4.04, ninth in the league.
