The 2018 season for the Phillies got off to a rocky start after new skipper Gabe Kapler--an analytics and nutrition nut--made some odd and questionable game day moves on the field. In some instances, his strategies back-fired hurting the team's ability to win. Fans and players alike were often left scratching their heads. The Phils would be over five hundred from April 11<sup>th</sup> through September 23<sup>rd</sup>. Regularly utilizing players at positions unfamiliar to them would drown any chances the ball club had to reach the post-season in the latter days of the campaign...The Phillies anemic hitting (.234) placed them fourteenth in the N.L. They hit 186 home runs (6<sup>th</sup>). Rhys Hoskins led the team in homers (34) and RBI (96). Cesar Hernandez had the top numbers in base hits (153) and runs scored (91)...Aaron Nola established himself as a true "Ace" with a 17-6 record and 224 punch outs to lead the pitching staff. He finished second in the N.L. in ERA. Zack Eflin won eleven games while Jake Arrieta turned in a disappointing ten. The staff ERA was 4.14 (11<sup>th</sup> in the league); they ended the season second in strikeouts (1,465).
