For the first time since 2007, the Yankees have a new manager: Aaron Boone, who hit one of the biggest home runs in Yankees' history, a walk-off homer in the 11th inning to win Game Seven versus Boston in the 2003 ALCS. Boone came to the job having no managerial experience at ANY level...Giancarlo Stanton was added to the line-up in a trade with the Marlins. He led "The Bronx Bombers" with 38 homers, 100 RBI, and 102 runs scored following an awful start to the season which drew lots of boos from Yankee fans. Rookie Miguel Andujar ended the year leading the team in base hits (170). There were three other teammates to join Andujar in hitting 27 home runs: Didi Gregorius, Aaron Hicks, and Aaron Judge. Rookie Gleyber Torres knocked out 24 homers. The Yanks hit .249 as a team and set a new major league record with 267 home runs...Luis Severino threw a lot of heat in winning 19 ball games and leading the pitching staff in strikeouts (220). Masahiro Tanaka was a 12-game winner while beleaguered Sonny Gray added eleven. The staff posted a 3.78 ERA, good for fifth in the A.L. Their 1,634 strikeouts were second...New York spent 26 days in the lead of the AL East; the last day was July 1st. They fell behind Boston by as many as 11 ½ games on September 16th. The Yankees beat Oakland in the AL Wild Card Game to advance into the post-season, but were eliminated from the playoffs in four games of their ALDS match-up with the soon-to-be World Champion Red Sox. Boston also won the regular-season series between the two arch-rivals, ten games to nine.
