The Astros celebrated their first World Championship after the 56th season in the history of the franchise. Part of the incentive which led to the title was the ball club's wish to bring home a championship for the city of Houston after it suffered severe damage and the loss of many lives in the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey during the season...HOUSTON STRONG...American League MVP Jose Altuve led the majors with a .346 batting average and finished second with 204 base hits. World Series MVP George Springer led the team with 34 home runs and tied Altuve for the lead in runs scored (112). Super-utilityman Marwin Gonzalez (23 dingers) had a team high 90 RBI. The Astros led the A.L. in hitting (.282) and were second with 238 home runs...Late season pick-up Justin Verlander was a perfect 5-0 for his new team which put the Astros over the top. A healthy, consistently sharp, fire-balling Charlie Morton tied Dallas Keuchel for the staff lead with 14 victories apiece. Morton led the staff with 163 K's. Brad Peacock was 13-2 in wins and losses while racking up 161 strikeouts. Astros hurlers posted a 4.12 ERA placing them fifth in the league...In the post-season, Houston knocked off Boston in four games in the ALDS, the Yankees 4-3 in the ALCS, and the Dodgers in an exciting and memorable World Series, four games to three.
