The defending World Champions won their second straight NL Central title after beating St. Louis, September 27th. Chicago knocked off Washington in five games in the NLDS before losing an encore meeting with the Dodgers in the NLCS, 4-1....For the season, Cubbie batters hit .255 and finished third in the N.L. in home runs (223). Anthony Rizzo led the ball club with 32 homers and 109 RBI. Kris Bryant had team highs in base hits (162) and runs scored (111). Kyle Schwarber launched 30 dingers...Jake Arrieta topped the pitching staff with 14 wins. He struck out 163 batters. Jon Lester won thirteen and led the hurlers with 180 K's. John Lackey was an even 12-12 in wins/losses. Wade Davis was fifth in the league in saves and punched out 79 batters. The staff's ERA was fourth in the league at 3.95..."The Friendly Confines" hosted just under 3.2 million fans for the season...At the All Star break, Chicago was 43-45, in second, 5 ½ games out of first place. They moved into the top spot for good, August 12th, at 60-55, and never looked back.
