For manager Brad Ausmus, his fourth and final season was as dismal as the one the Tigers suffered through in 2003. In '03, the Tigers lost 119 games with a bunch of no-names. On September 22nd, after much speculation by the media, the team announced he would not return as skipper for 2018. Detroit tied the Giants for the worst record in the majors...The ball club ended the year eighth in the A.L. in batting (.258) and twelfth in home runs (187). Justin Upton bashed 28 homers before he was traded to the Angels; his number stood up as the Tigers' leader. Nick Castellanos was next with 26 dingers and topped the team with 101 RBI and 167 base hits. He also tallied 36 doubles and ten triples for the year. Ian Kinsler popped 22 home runs and led the team in runs scored (90)...As in '03, the Tigers' pitching was horrendous. They were dead last in the majors with a bloated 5.36 ERA. Prior to his trade to Houston, Justin Verlander won ten ball games and his strikeout total (176) would lead the staff. Michael Fulmer also won ten contests. Verlander would lose two possible no-hitters with Detroit against Seattle and Pittsburgh, both in the sixth inning, while Matt Boyd, who was 6-11 in wins/losses, pitched a no-hitter into the ninth against the White Sox before it was dashed with a two-out single...Miguel Cabrera, 34, mustered 16 homers and 60 RBI.
