Aaron Judge ended April with ten home runs, a new rookie record. He broke Mark McGwire's record for homers in a season by a first year player (49), September 25<sup>th</sup>. After going into a post-All Star break slump, Judge recovered nicely to lead the A.L. with 52 home runs and 128 runs scored to win the league's Rookie of the Year Award. He led the Yanks with 114 RBI. Judge also led the league with 127 bases on balls and the majors with 208 strikeouts. Slugger Gary Sanchez followed with 33 dingers and 90 RBI. Brett Gardner topped the ball club with 157 base hits. Didi Gregorius walloped 25 home runs and drove in eighty-seven. The Yankees hit .262 (third in the A.L.) and a league high 241 home runs for the year...Fire-balling Luis Severino really came into his own going 14-6 and leading the pitching staff with 230 strikeouts. C C Sabathia was 14-5 in wins/losses while Masahiro Tanaka won thirteen games and struck out 194 batters. Dellin Betances racked up 100 K's but was used less and less by Joe Girardi in critical spots late in the season and playoffs due to Betances' inexplicable loss of hitting the strike zone. He walked 44 batters in the regular season. Chad Green posted 103 punch outs and Aroldis Chapman sixty-nine. The Yankees staff ended the year third in ERA (3.72)...New York finished two games in back of Boston in the AL East, but beat the Twins in the A.L. Wild Card Game and Cleveland, 3-2, in the ALDS before being eliminated by Houston in the ALCS, 4-3...Following reports of clashes with ball players and the Yankees seeking a new, fresh outlook, Girardi was surprisingly fired at season's end after ten years in the dugout as well as being one of the most highly rated skippers in the game.
