**Derek Jeter, a future Yankee captain, won the A.L. Rookie of the Year Award following a remarkable season. He LED the ball club with 183 base hits, was second with 104 runs scored, and hit ten homers while driving in seventy-eight runs...Other team leaders at the plate include smooth-fielding Bernie Williams (29 home runs, 102 RBI, 108 runs scored); Tino Martinez (25 dingers, 117 RBI); and "gamer" Paul O'Neill (19 homers, 91 RBI). Mid-season pick-up Cecil Fielder contributed thirteen home runs; Darryl Strawberry added eleven along with Ruben Sierra. The Yanks were second in the A.L. with a .288 batting average, but twelfth with 162 homers...Andy Pettitte led the pitching staff with a sparkling 21-8 W/L record and 162 strikeouts. Lefties Jimmy Key and Kenny Rogers each won twelve games. "Doc" Gooden was 11-7 with 126 K's. Gooden would no-hit the Mariners at Yankee Stadium, May 14<sup>th</sup>. The staff ERA was 4.65... "The Bronx Bombers" returned to the World Series for the first time since 1981 and knocked off a formidable Atlanta Braves ball club, four games to two. It was the Yankees first trophy (#23 overall) since 1978 and the beginning of a dynasty which stretched into the early 2000s and earned skipper Joe Torre a future entry into the Hall of Fame...After going down, 2-0, to the Braves, the Yanks won four straight to be World Champions...In Game One of the ALCS versus Baltimore, Jeter hit a fly ball to the "short porch" in rightfield at Yankee Stadium and as the ball arrived at the wall it was interfered with by 12-year old Jeffrey Maier. Maier reached over and below the wall (just out of the grasp of Orioles' outfielder Tony Tarasco) and deflected the ball into the stands. The hit was ruled a two-run homer in the last of the eighth which gave the Yankees a heart-stopping five to four victory. New York won the ALCS, four games to one, after beating Texas in the ALDS, 3-1.**
