Derek Jeter and Bernie Williams finished third and fourth, respectively, on the list of major league batting leaders. Jeter tied for third in the big leagues with 134 runs scored while Chuck Knoblauch was tenth with 120. Jeter's 219 base hits also led the majors; he was sixth in AL MVP voting. As a team, "The Bronx Bombers" rightly earned that moniker: .282 batting average (3rd in the league) and 193 home runs (8th). Their 900 runs scored also placed them third in the A. L. Tino Martinez led the ball club with 28 home runs; he drove in 105. Williams (202 base hits) was second in homers (25) and posted the most RBI (115). He crossed home plate 116 times. Jeter popped 24 home runs and knocked in 102. Paul O'Neill and "Chili" Davis both stroked 19 homers; O'Neill collected 110 RBI...Yankee hurlers ended the year with the second-best ERA in the A. L. (4.13). Closer Mariano Rivera's 45 saves not only topped the majors, they were the largest figure in the staff's league-high fifty. The Yanks five prime starters all won in double-figures and 69 percent of the team's victories: Orlando Hernandez (17), Andy Pettitte and Roger Clemens (both 14), David Cone (12), and Hideki Irabu (11). Cone and Clemens were one and two, respectively, in strikeouts: Cone (177), Clemens (163)...New York's pitching staff allowed the Texas Rangers a single run during a 3-0 series sweep in the ALDS. The arch-rival Boston Red Sox were vanquished in five games as the Yankees won the American League pennant. The franchise's 25th World Series crown was the result of a four-game sweep of the Atlanta Braves in the Fall Classic. Rivera, who saved two games, was the Series MVP. The Yanks out-scored Atlanta, 21-9, and hit five home runs to the Braves' one...At Yankee Stadium, July 18th, Cone allowed nary a base-runner and struck out ten Montreal Expos during the majors' 16th perfect game and a 6-0 victory. It was a contest interrupted by a 33-minute rain delay as well.
