After finishing second in the NL Central behind Milwaukee, the Cards garnered the Wild Card spot the final day of the season and knocked off the Phillies in the NLDS, 3-2. In the NLCS, the Redbirds eliminated the division champion Brewers in six games. Through five games, the Texas Rangers held a 3-2 advantage before the Cardinals won the final two contests at Busch Stadium for their eleventh title in the Fall Classic. It was Tony LaRussa's last stand in the dugout as manager. The legendary skipper, considered ahead of his time utilizing analytics, retired after the season finale. David Freese was the MVP of both the NLCS and World Series. In the post-season, he drove in a record twenty-one runs...Team leaders: Albert Pujols (37 homers, 99 RBI, 173 hits, 105 runs) and Lance Berkman (31 homers, 94 RBI, 147 hits, 90 runs). Matt Holliday blasted twenty-two dingers and drove in seventy-five. The Cards led the N.L. in hitting (.273), runs scored (762), and were sixth with 162 homers...Kyle Lohse led the pitching staff with fourteen wins while Chris Carpenter topped the staff in strikeouts (191). Lefty Jaime Garcia finished the year with thirteen victories; Jake Westbrook and Kyle McClellan had twelve apiece. The staff ERA was 3.74, sixth in the N.L...Yadier Molina, unquestionably the best backstop in the game, won his fourth straight Gold Glove Award.
