A very solid ball club which combined great offense with equally great pitching that lost a toughly fought World Series to the Cardinals, four games to three...The Rangers were led in home runs by Ian Kinsler and Adrian Beltre who each popped 32 round-trippers. Kinsler led the team with 121 runs scored. Beltre was good for 105 runs batted in. Michael Young was tops with 106 RBI, 213 base hits, and 41 doubles. Mike Napoli blasted 30 homers while Nelson Cruz added twenty-nine more. Texas hitters clobbered 210 home runs (2nd in the A.L.) and put up a .283 batting average to lead the league ...The pitching staff had two 16-game winners: C. J. Wilson and Derek Holland. Wilson was the staff's strikeout leader (206). Colby Lewis and Matt Harrison each won 14 games...The pitching staff compiled a 3.79 ERA and SEVEN shutouts--the latter led the league...To get to the World Series, the Rangers knocked off Tampa Bay in the ALDS, 3-1, and the Tigers in the ALCS, 4-2...During one of the hottest summers Texans could ever remember, the Rangers won their second consecutive AL West title, posted the most victories in franchise history, and set a new attendance record of nearly 2.95 million...The ball club jumped into first place for good July 6th at 49-41. An 18-9 record for July and a 19-6 mark in September decisively helped clinch the division title.
