The Boston Red Stockings transformed themselves into the "bearded wonders" with former pitching coach John Farrell at the helm after the disastrous 2012 debacle with Bobby Valentine in charge. Fenway Pahhhkk was alive and rockin' again in 2013 with sold out games and "Sweet Caroline" being sung in the stands in the middle of the eighth inning with more fervor than ever. Baseball can be so cool! The Bostons won the franchise's eighth World Championship after beating the Cardinals in six games. **BOSTON STRONG!!** (The rally cry after the tragic Boston Marathon bomb attack.) Rightfielder Shane Victorino became exclusively a right-handed batter for 2013. A series of nagging hamstring, back, and knee ailments forced him to forego switch-hitting. He DID win an American League Gold Glove Award...Team leaders: David Ortiz (30 homers, 103 RBI) and Jon Lester (15-8 record, 177 strikeouts). Mike Napoli clubbed 23 homers and knocked home 92 runs. The Red Sox scored the most runs in the A.L. (853) while hitting .277 and 178 home runs...Clay Buchholz won twelve games, Felix Doubront eleven, and John Lackey ten. The staff ERA was 3.79...The Red Sox knocked off the Rays in the ALDS and eliminated the Tigers in the ALCS to reach the Fall Classic.
