THE GIANTS' THIRD WORLD SERIES CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM IN FIVE YEARS: 2010, 2012, 2014... The Giants beat the Pirates in Pittsburgh, 8-0, to advance into the post-season after finishing second in the NL West behind the Dodgers by six games. San Francisco would knock off the Nationals in the NLDS, 3-1, and then defeat the Cardinals in the NLCS, 4-1. The World Series was a terrific meeting with the Kansas City Royals which the Giants would win, four games to three... Pablo Sandoval, a huge fan favorite (aka "The Kung Fu Panda") hit 16 homers with 73 RBI for the year. "Buster" Posey (22 homers, 89 RBI); Sandoval and Mike Morse (16 dingers, 61 RBI) led the Giants' offensively. Hunter Pence had a "triple double": 29 doubles, 10 triples, and 20 homers. Pence led the ball club with 180 hits and 106 runs. He drove in seventy-four. Brandon Crawford compiled a "triple double" as well. The shortstop collected 20 doubles, 10 triples, and ten home runs. He had 69 RBI. The Giants hit .245 and 132 home runs for the year...Madison Bumgarner (18 wins, 219 strikeouts) led the pitching staff and was named the World Series MVP. "Mad Bum" completed four games and had two shutouts. He also hit four homers during the regular season, two doubles, and knocked in 15 runs using 17 hits to do it. Tim Lincecum was 12-9 and pitched a no-hitter, June 25th, against San Diego at A T @ T Park. During the 16th "no-no" in Giants franchise history, Lincecum struck out six and walked one batter. For the regular season, he posted 134 K's. Tim Hudson was a nine-game winner; Ryan Vogelsong won eight. Vogelsong was second on the staff with 151 strikeouts. In the World Series, Bumgarner was 2-0 with a 0.43 ERA, 17 strikeouts, and one walk in 21 innings...For the season, the Giants' staff posted a 3.50 ERA.
