Team leaders: Third baseman Hector "Heity" Cruz (13 homers, 71 RBI) and catcher Ted Simmons (5 home runs, 75 RBI, 159 hits). Keith Hernandez hit five dingers and drove in forty-six. At 37 years of age, Lou Brock finished fifth in the N.L. in stolen bases and led the team with 73 runs...Lynn McGlothen led the pitching staff with 13 wins, 10 complete games, and four shutouts. Lefty Pete Falcone won 12 contests, led the staff with 138 K's, and had nine complete games. John Denny won eleven games and Bob Forsch eight for the season. Closer Al Hrabosky whiffed 73 batters..."Red" Schoendienst managed his last full season with the Cards in '76. He would return for parts of two other seasons ('80 and '90). His tenure in St. Louis had begun as skipper in 1965...The Cardinals sported flashy "Columbia Blue" road uniforms for the first time and would wear them through 1984...The Redbirds ended the campaign 29 games in back of the NL East champion, Phillies, who won the season series, 12-6...The Cards hit just 63 home runs for the season and .260 at the plate. Their 126 stolen bases placed them sixth in the league. The staff ERA was 3.60 (eighth in the N.L.) and fifth with eleven shutouts.
