The Wrigley Field faithful suffered through another season with no pennant, but the team DID feature Pete LaCock at first base. LaCock is the son of "Hollywood Squares" game show host, Peter Marshall, who is no relation to the Cubbies' skipper. LaCock hit eight home runs and knocked in 28 for the season. He was considered very dependable with the glove...Rick Monday hit the most homers for the Cubs (32) and had the team high in runs scored (107). He had 77 RBI. Bill Madlock popped 15 home runs, led the team with 84 RBI, and the major leagues in batting average. He also topped the ball club in hits (174). Jerry Morales hit 16 dingers and drove in sixty-seven. Chicago hit .251 for the year and finished fourth in the N.L. in home runs (105)...Ray Burris topped the pitching staff with 15 victories, ten complete games, and four shutouts. Rick Reuschel was next with 14 wins, nine complete games, and a staff leading 146 strikeouts. Bill Bonham was a nine-game winner while Steve Renko added eight. The staff ended the season eleventh in the league with a 3.93 ERA...Mid-way through the schedule, the Cubs were 34-47 and in fifth place, 20 games out of first.
