Outstanding defensively, Don Money led the Brewers with 25 homers and 83 RBI. He tied Cecil Cooper for the team lead in runs scored (86). Sixto Lezcano was next with 21 dingers while Cooper hit twenty, led the team in hits (193), and knocked in 78 runs. Former Oakland A's captain, Sal Bando, was signed as a free agent by the Brewers in November '76 which led to the transition of Money from third to second base. Bando added a welcome 17 homers and 82 RBI to the offense. Shortstop Robin Yount continued to improve each year since joining the club in 1974. He led the team with 34 doubles and finished second in hits (174). Utility man Ken McMullen, who had forged a yeoman's career which started in 1962, hit a home run in his last career at bat on September 14th. The Brewers, as a team, hit .258 for the season and 125 home runs...Jerry Augustine was the top winner on the pitching staff with 12 victories and led the team with 10 complete games. "Moose" Haas logged 113 strikeouts to lead the staff to go along with 10 wins. Ace Jim Slaton posted 10 victories, as well, and 104 K's. A staff ERA of 4.32 was eleventh in the A.L....The Brewers, who were originally the expansion Seattle "Pilots" in 1969 and fled for Milwaukee in 1970, played the franchise's first game back in Seattle at the Kingdome on July 1st. They beat the expansion Mariners, 2-1. The crowd derisively booed and jeered the Brewers when they took the field after an eight year absence. The Brewers finished a woeful 33 games behind the AL East champ Yankees.
