After being away for three seasons, "Big Mac," Willie McCovey, returned to the Giants to lead the team with 28 homers and 86 runs batted in. Darrell Evans and Gary Thomasson were next with 17 home runs apiece. Evans drove home 72 runs; Thomasson collected seventy-one RBI. Bill Madlock, picked up in an off-season trade with the Cubs, led the team with 161 base hits and 28 doubles. Derrel Thomas scored a team high 75 runs. Twenty-one year old Jack Clark, soon to be one of the National League's premier power hitters, socked 13 dingers. The ball club ended the year tenth in batting (.253) and sixth in homers (134)...Number One starter Ed Halicki led the pitching staff with 16 wins and 168 strikeouts. Jim Barr won twelve games and Bob Knepper eleven. Closer Gary Lavelle whiffed 93 batters. The staff ERA was 3.75, fifth in the N.L...The Giants would finish the season 23 games behind the NL West champion Dodgers. San Francisco won only four of eighteen games versus their arch-rivals....Season attendance was last again in the league at 700,056.
