**Bobby Bonds was the leader of the Angels' offense with 37 home runs, 115 RBI, 156 base hits, and 103 runs scored. Designated hitter Don Baylor, a free-agent signee, slugged 25 home runs and was second with 75 runs batted in. With free agency and its big money now in fast motion, the Halos also signed the highly regarded Bobby Grich in November '76. His season was shortened due to a back problem which would plague him in coming years. He hit just seven homers and drove in twenty-three for the season. The ball club shelled out additional cash for a third free-agent, Joe Rudi. He played in sixty-four games and socked 13 home runs while driving in fifty-three. The team would hit .255 and 131 homers during the season...Nolan Ryan led the pitching staff with 19 wins, 341 K's, 22 complete games, and 204 bases on balls. Frank Tanana was 15-9 with 205 strikeouts, 20 complete games, and a team leading seven shutouts. The staff ended the year with a 3.75 ERA and led the A.L. in strikeouts (965)...The Angels changed managers, July 11<sup>th</sup>, with Dave Garcia taking over the reins and the team's record at 39-42...California ended the season 28 games behind AL West champ, Kansas City, and 10 ½ games behind fourth place Minnesota. The Halos were 6-9 in their season series with the Royals and 7-8 against the Twins.**
