In Tommy Lasorda's first full season as Dodger skipper, he turned the tables on the Cincinnati Reds who won the NL West in '76 by double digits. With arguably the best Dodgers team ever (some say), the ball club won their division by 10 games over the Redlegs...Steve Garvey led the Dodgers with 33 home runs, 115 RBI, and 192 base hits. He also was awarded a Gold Glove. Reggie Smith socked 32 dingers with 87 runs batted in for the year. He led the ball club in runs scored (104). Ron Cey and "Dusty" Baker both hit 30 home runs. Cey knocked in 110 runs while Baker added eighty-six. Rick Monday popped 15 homers and the speedy Davey Lopes was good for eleven. The Dodgers ended the year fifth in hitting (.266) but led the N.L. with 191 homers...Tommy John led the pitching staff with 20 victories, 11 complete games, and tied Don Sutton with three shutouts. Rick Rhoden was 16-10 while All Star Game MVP Sutton was 14-8 with 150 K's. Lefty Doug Rau matched Sutton in wins. Burt Hooton was 12-7 for the season with a team high 153 strikeouts. The staff led the league in ERA (3.22). They allowed 582 runs, the fewest in the N.L...The Dodgers knocked off the Phillies in the ALCS, three games to one. They would lose the World Series to the Yankees in six games after the ball clubs had split the first four.
