Only three years after winning a World Series, Charlie Finley's A's dynasty has come crashing down...Vida Blue and Billy North are the only star players left to represent this "white elephant" of a team...The A's MGR in '76, Chuck Tanner, was traded to the Pirates for catcher Manny Sanguillen during the off-season. Finley attempted to trade Blue to the Reds for cash but Commissioner Bowie Kuhn vetoed the deal. On a positive note, future core players Jeff Newman, Mitchell Page, Wayne Gross, and pitcher Mike Norris are showing very promising ability to build around. Only 495,599 baseball fans bothered to show up to watch this crew of "never were's" and cast offs, the WORST attendance the A's ever had in the Bay Area...Gross led the team with 22 homers. Page socked 21 dingers and led the team with 75 RBI and 85 runs scored. Sanguillen had the team high in hits (157). The A's were LAST in batting average (.240) and hit 117 homers (12th)...Blue led the pitching staff with 14 wins, 154 K's, and 16 complete games. "Doc" Medich won ten ball games while Rick Langford was 8-19 with 141 strikeouts. The staff ERA (4.04) was sixth in the A.L...Managers' records: Jack McKeon (26-27), Bobby Winkles (37-71). McKeon was fired from his post, June 10th...The A's WON two season series versus the Angels and Toronto.
