"Parlez vous francais?" The tri-colored caps the new Expos wore are still "chic": Bleu, Blanc, et Rouge. Montreal played at Parc Jarry through 1976. (It truly IS a large park that had the ball park in the middle of it all. I wonder whatever happened to the swimming pool just beyond the right field fence?) The Montreal fans almost immediately (if not sooner) fell in love with "Rusty" Staub and his bright red hair. He was arguably the ball club's best player. They christened him "Le Grand Orange" and the name followed him wherever he played later in his career...Staub led the Expos in their freshman season with 29 home runs, 166 hits, and 89 runs scored. Another Expo who initially drew much attention was "Coco" Laboy who led the ball club with 83 RBI. He hit 18 homers. Mack Jones added 22 dingers and 79 RBI...Bill Stoneman led the pitching staff with eleven wins and 185 K's. He no-hit the Phillies in Philadelphia, April 17th, in only the Expos' ninth game and his FIFTH major league start. While hurling his "no-no" Stoneman struck out eight and walked five. Lefty Dan McGinn won seven games working out of the bullpen while Steve Renko and Howie Reed both won six contests. The staff ERA was LAST in the N.L. at 4.33...Expos batters hit .240 for the year. Their 125 home runs ranked them sixth in the league.
